Tarheel Weimaraner Rescue had a very productive year in 2017 and is already off to a great start in 2018.

DOG UPDATES:

For the months of November, December, and January, we received 36 dogs and 11 were successfully placed in their forever homes. Several more adoptions are pending. We are pleased to announce that several dogs that multiple dogs that had been in foster care for over 6 months went to their new homes during this period.

This bonded pair first came to us in December 2016 and we wanted to adopt them together. Although Blue had to be treated for heartworms first, Sadie waited with him until both were ready. Sadly, they had a long wait until the perfect home came along. Sadie and Blue found their new home just before Christmas with one of our long-time volunteers, fosters, and repeat adopters and their two young children.

"After many years of no Weims in our life due to many moves & two babies 20 month apart we brought Sadie & Blue home in time for Christmas. When I first met them, I felt like the Grinch who's heart finally grew big again.

Over the past 10 years we have fostered many for TWR & adopted several others. Our last adopted Weim, our beloved Tara passed away at 15 about the time my youngest was born. However, life got crazy & I forgot how much I missed having Weims in our life. Our kids have grown up with paintings & pictures of Weims all over the house -- always asking when we would have another one.



So the day before Christmas we put a bow on Sadie & Blue & introduced them to the kids. It was a Christmas we will all never forget. The kids were so happy I thought they would cry in excitement...The pair of them came into our home like they have always been here with us. I don't believe we could have hand chosen a puppy or any other pair that was more perfect for us. Sadie & Blue are fantastic in every way & are adored by our family. Thank you for making our holiday & filling the emptiness that existed without a Weim in our home. It feels like the missing puzzle piece has now been put back in place. Sadie & Blue are a special pair & we love watching them make memories every day with our family & grow older along side our kids!

Cool fun facts: Sadie uses our screen door like a person-- in & out both using her nose, Sadie also gets in Joey's rocking Lazyboy which has to take some good balance, both are into prey & chase flying Hawks around the yard...both are great watch dogs which gives me a lot of comfort when Joey travels & at night, both dig & play in the sandbox with the kids & religiously wait for Cole's Kindergarten bus to come home in the afternoon, every evening I enjoy being a Weim sandwich on the couch & every day the kids tell me the dogs are the best present they have ever received!

Jessy

The July newsletter promised to follow the story of Jessy, the 13-year-old that we had for over a year before she went to her forever home in July. Sadly, she was diagnosed with an inoperable oral Squamous cell tumor on December 21 and passed away on January 8. The wonderful couple that adopted Jessy also had a 7-year-old female and the four of them did everything together—hiking, going to the beach, playing in the snow. Due to Jessy's age, they had a huge bucket list for fun things for them to do together and were especially looking forward to more fun things in the spring. Unfortunately, they only had 7 months to treat her like a princess. They even built a cart for her to ride in when she got tired on their outings. Jessy's last year was the best of her life with foster mom Kathy LeCavalier and in her forever home.

"She brought us much joy and we loved her gentle spirit. I wish time had not slipped through our fingers as quickly as it did." RIP sweet Jessy with your butterfly kisses.

Chris

Chris came to us in May 2017 after having been posted on Craig's List. He had to live outside because the landlord would not allow him in the house. His barking upset the neighbors.

When we got him, Chris was covered in fleas and ticks, had an awful coat, had nails like talons, and had a tennis ball size growth underneath. Dr. Rita McGinnis performed surgery on his testicular tumor (Sertoli tumor), removed a perianal mass, AND excised some buckshot pellets.



Sweet Chris recovered beautifully and enjoyed the next several months in

foster care. Finally, his day came—he was adopted by the same wonderful couple that had fostered Blue in his last few months (see October 2017 for Blue's story). Chris' new family had previously adopted a dog in 2010 that had been in foster care for almost 2 years. Unfortunately, Chris suffered GDV two weeks after adoption, but his new family recognized it and rushed him to the ER for surgery immediately. He had excellent care and support at home, was a great patient, and had a successful recovery.

"Tomorrow marks 1 month from the day we picked him up at the Dog Club of Wilmington. Chris has settled in so well. Having never been in a house before you would never know it. He has the best house manners, no accidents, doesn't get on the furniture (we even try to get him on the couch but he won't). His little personality is slowly coming out and he is your typical silly Weim that makes us laugh a lot. He is starting to play with toys and it makes my heart so happy when I can hear him playing. The first few nights with us he wasn't really sure of sleeping in a bed with us at night, but now he LOVES when it's time to go to bed. He jumps right in between us and curls up in all the blankets and sleeps until the morning. He has brought us SO much joy AND some scares during his first month with us. We love him so much and can't wait to see him 6 months from now. He is finally living the life every dog should live!!!"

Jimmy

Jimmy came to us in June after the death of his owner. Although only 6, Jimmy had been blind for about two years because of Retinal Degeneration. As sweet as he is, he is slow to warm up to new situations, people, and other dogs. Jimmy was very lucky because a wonderful family from Missouri took him home to live with them and their Weim Lola.

"Jimmy came to us just a few days before Christmas. We were looking for a boy we could provide a good home for. We had lost our beloved Biggie a few months earlier at the age of 11, and were looking for a new companion to open our hearts to, one who would also be a calm friend for our 14-year-old Weim Lola. I had been looking at various Weim rescue pages for days, and as soon as I saw Jimmy's picture and read that he was blind, I knew he was the right one for us. As a blind Weim, we knew he would have a harder time getting adopted because he presents a unique set of challenges, and that made us want to take care of him all the more.



We took a road trip to North Carolina to meet him and brought Lola with us. He has had a few challenges settling in, but we've been working through them with him and he's doing a wonderful job! As a blind Weim, we can just imagine how much more stressful any change must be for him, and he's had quite a few changes over the last few years.

Right now, our biggest challenge is that Jimmy is such a baby -- he refuses to go outside in the rain or the cold, instead preferring to sneak in the other room to pee and, at 93 pounds, he pees A LOT!!! But I'm sure we'll be able to work through it together, and maybe I'll be able to use this as the excuse I need to finally get new carpet! Jimmy loves wearing clothes, but he's so big that I can't find things to fit! My husband has started donating some of his own old shirts to Jimmy's wardrobe. It's amazing how quickly he learned his way around the house! We live in a two story, we have a doggy door, and he has to go down a flight of stairs outside to get to the yard, but he's had no problem finding his way around. He's so smart! He loves going on his daily walks and playing keep away (my husband is the object he tries to catch), and he's learning some tricks too. He and Lola are getting along well, and he's made himself right at home. His favorite spot is right in the middle of the couch, so that he can have Lola to one side of him and me or my husband on the other side. He's so affectionate, giving us hugs and kisses all the time. He does seem rather put out that he's not allowed to sleep in bed with us, but it's wonderful for me to start every day with him throwing his two front legs over my chest and licking me in the face to wake me up and tell me good morning.

We paid a visit to our vet yesterday (Jimmy was along to support Lola), who made a point of telling us how far he's seen Jimmy come in the past few months. The vet commented he can see that Jimmy has really bonded with us, he's secure, and is clearly thriving. We were so happy to hear that and feel so lucky to have Jimmy as part of our family. He's such a good boy, and we love him so much! Now if we could only find clothes big enough to fit him..."


