PERSONAL UPDATES

Congratulations to **Jen and Ryan Wale** on the birth of Eva in May. Eva, big brother Jacob, and Jen and Ryan are all doing well. Congratulations also to **Linda Schilling** and **Toni Sweetland** on recently retiring from their "day jobs" (i.e., their paying jobs).

DOG NEWS

Between May 1 and July 31, we took in eight dogs and placed eight in their forever homes. Three of our new dogs were over 10 years old, one was 9, and one was 8. But also during this time, four lucky families adopted seniors – a 12 year old, an 11 year old, a 9 year old, and an 8 year old. So thankfully there are people that appreciate and love older dogs.



During this same time, sadly we lost two of our senior foster dogs. **Jax** was a 10 year old male with horrible growths in several places, and one was so large that it pushed his shoulder forward and interfered with his mobility and his ability to lie down. The surgery to remove that *10 pound tumor* was successful. The location of the tumor was attached to shoulder muscle and entwined in a lot of blood vessels, but his shoulder no longer pushed

forward, and he was finally comfortable. He did well post op for the next five days, and then became acutely ill. Despite everything they threw at him, he crossed over the RB two days later. Necropsy confirmed cause of death as a ruptured tumor on the adrenal gland – not related to his surgery at all.

We also lost 13 year **Bluesy** who was in permanent foster care for 2 ½ years. Soon after he joined his foster home, his rear mobility issues became very evident. His loving foster family helped him and kept him comfortable. During his entire time with us, he was wrapped in so much love with his family. These were probably the best years of his life, and his happy demeanor reflected that. His foster Mom knew when it was time to say goodbye to him. On his way to the vet's office, she treated him to McDonald's "Because your last meal should be the best", and he had a huge smile on his face.

Arthur

Arthur (age 8) came to us from a dreadful situation in which his owner had turned to hard drugs and was ignoring him. He hadn't been fed properly for six months, was horribly thin, and had infected sores all over his back. And he craved human attention, howling or moving anything he could to get to people. But once surrendered, his life changed forever. Lucky Arthur was adopted by a repeat adopter from Massachusetts. Dad and his daughter made the trip to NC, met him, and immediately took him to their hotel to see how he would do over the weekend. He did so well, they cut short their weekend visit and headed home earlier than planned. We have enjoyed hearing updates since this underweight boy went home.



In the first few weeks, Arthur ("Artie the one man party") took instructions well and was good with adults and children but was unpredictable when meeting other dogs. He would play with them, but soon wanted to exert his dominance. The adopters continued to work with him, and gradually introduced him to other dogs until he learned to accept them.

A couple of months later his adopter reported he had much improved. He is very much a mischievous guy. Food, for some unknown reason, is disappearing from the counter. (That included

a pound of butter that was left on the counter to soften.) He doesn't even mind if I'm in the same room!!!!! Nothing shy about this guy. He is now comfortably off leash in the appropriate surroundings and is very much enjoying squirrels and the occasional deer. He is very well mannered around the grandchildren, and has on occasion had a house guest, Joey, my son's dog overnight. He and Joey greatly enjoy each other's company, share walks, treats and toys. We've had just one seventeen mile walk, but when the cooler fall arrives I've got several ten mile walks lined up.

We recently entertained 60 people at a dinner party and he worked the room like candidate on the campaign trail, not one complaint over the course of the evening. Although my daughter was caught feeding him 'treats'. And his ribs no longer show either.

Lucy

Lucy was 7 years old when surrendered by her owners because they no longer had time to give her the attention she deserved. But Lucy now has a family that gives her lots of attention and she also has two dog "siblings".

We are the ones who got lucky. Someone knew that we needed her as much as she needed us...Lucy is doing so very well! She and Mackenzie (Bernese Mountain Dog) are now best friends. Lucy is alpha, then Macky and poor Buckets (French Bulldog) is at the bottom but it doesn't seem to bother him. She still has no interest in the pool but she loves people! We hosted a basketball team party last night and she was right in the middle of everything.



You guys at the Tarheel Weimaraner Rescue are amazing! ...This has been by far the best experience with bringing home a new canine family member. We will be coming to you guys again. I encourage all my friends to consider a rescue with your program because of how thorough your questions were. An older adult Weimar is calm and lazy. Just our speed. I also could tell that your dogs would be well placed and be safe. I wish all dogs had this kind of care. This is a special breed, incredibly intelligent, loyal, protective and affectionate. Lucy will follow us all over the house tail ready to go crazy when she gets kisses and a back scratch. She loves the couch and that is where you can find her on a lazy afternoon.

Our whole family adores her. She completed this home. Thank you!!

Toby

Toby was 12 years old when we pulled him from a shelter after his owner had surrendered him to be euthanized. The shelter contacted us after their evaluation determined he didn't need to be euthanized. He did have some significant problems, including conjunctivitis probably caused by a small lid tumor, an umbilical hernia that he had for almost 13 years, and a severe lick granuloma on a rear foot. He was seen by an ophthalmologist for his eye issues and we treated his granuloma, and both improved tremendously over the next several months. Fortunately his story struck the hearts of a wonderful adopter that saw what senior Weims have to offer.



Toby's story pulled at our heartstrings since he was a senior and had been surrendered to the shelter. We have an older dog who had lost the other two pack members within the past year, and we were looking for a companion for her. However, we have two small children and needed to find a dog that could fit into our home with minimal stress to us and the pet. So, when we read his story and asked questions, it sounded like he would be perfect. His first couple of weeks were up and down, especially with introducing him to our other dog. Each day seemed to get better. We have never had a Weimaraner, just random breeds and mixed breed rescue dogs; so we had to learn a few things too, such as NEVER leave ANY food out. After about 2 months, Toby finally accepted and learned

that this was his forever home. He loves us and we love him. No more trying to run out of the front door, no more pacing around, just a relaxed old dog that wiggles his tail 100 times a second when he sees us. And even though our other dog. Tess, would never admit it...she loves Toby.

Doozie and Dr. Rita McGinnis continue on their march in Rally titles. During this time, Doozie completed her 2nd Rally Master, Rally Advanced Excellent, and Novice Trick Dog (TKN). She is now officially Doozie Dazzles Daily CD PCD BN RAE RM2 TKN JH CGC. But I just call her Doozie.
