Rescue Report:

For the months of August and September, rescue took in 19 dogs, including three more HW+ dogs. We are happy to report that we placed 12 dogs in their new homes. We have had some fun intakes (puppies) and some very special and rewarding adoptions. Here are some highlights of a few of them.



Dexter was surrendered to TWR in August due to his owner's extremely demanding work travel schedule. He had placed Dexter himself months ago, and when he came home for a couple of days, the person returned Dexter saving he didn't want him anymore. Sadly, Dexter had gained a tremendous amount of weight (weighed in at 132 lbs!), and had bad sores on his legs apparently from spending too much time on concrete. Fortunately Dexter improved while boarded, and has been adopted by a family that intends to run with him once he loses enough weight for it to be safe for him. They are taking his weight reduction seriously and slowly, and building up his stamina by slow walks - and less food. Good luck Dexter!

Georgia and Suede, another duo that came to us together, were adopted together fortunately. Their new Dad reports that Suede is a Daddy's boy, and they are still working with Georgia. Sweet Georgia doesn't seem to know how to have fun, but has finally started wagging her tail. Her new mom describes her demeanor as "someone broke her joy button". This loving and patient family will win her over, and show her what a wonderful life she has. Best wishes Georgia and Suede!



In early August Kathy L. was contacted about three 8 week old puppies which she accepted immediately. Kathy lovingly fostered them, and named them Windy, Stormy, and Rainy. They are happily in their wonderful new homes (all previous adopters), and are scattered in three states. Kathy still misses their puppy breath!







Kaya lives in Massachusetts with her Dad and older brother Blue (FKA General Dwight David Eisenhower – Ike) who was adopted in 2013. She enjoys living on the Cape and following her Dad and big brother everywhere. She is Blue's shadow.

She has learned not to spit them out because Emma enjoys a crunchy treat and will eat it up very quickly. Still doesn't know what to think of the beach, yet! Harper has been a wonderful addition to my family!"



Sweet Fritz, our 11 year old that had been in foster care for 6 months, went to his new home in September. We are so happy for Fritz and his new family! We have been blessed with people that know how much joy a senior dog can bring to their lives. Fritz's family's words are a beautiful testimonial for adopting an older dog:

"Where do I start!? It took me 3 years to be able to think about adopting another Weim but when I saw Fritz on the rescue site I knew he was 'the one' and that it was time to open my heart again. He is such a wonderful fellow and so laid back. We live in the woods and when we go on our walks he just ambles along sniffing the air and listening to all of

the sounds. He is very obedient and comes when his name is called and can sit when asked. He also is very polite and takes his treats gently from our hands. No barking, no counter surfing, no begging for food when we eat. His only little sneaky action so far has been to find a place on the couch to sleep at night instead of on his doggie bed (which is perfectly fine as our other 2 have chosen the couch instead of their bed as well!!)

When we brought Fritz home he was a little jumpy at all of the sounds in our house (5 people and 2 other dogs) but by the next day you'd have thought he had been here all along. He just fit right in and is a wonderful, loving dog to all who meet him. My dad calls him a perfect gentleman and that suits him to a T.

I want to say a special thank you to his foster mom, Kathy M., for taking such good care of Fritz until he found his forever home. I know she was really attached and I thank her so much for sharing Fritz with our family. We love him very, very much.

All I can say is, thank you Tarheel Weimaraner Rescue for all of the hard work that you do in finding these truly magnificent dogs their forever homes. "

September 5 Meeting Minutes

The Tarheel Weimaraner Club meeting of Thursday, Sept. 5, 2015 was held at the Backyard Bistro in Raleigh. The meeting, in the absence of President Jack Sappenfield, was called to order by Vice-President Stacy Libow at 7 pm.

Present were members: Betta Breuhaus, Tammi Byers, Rusty Jenrette, Stacy Libow, Carol and Charles Parron, Helen Sanderford, Lucy Sappenfield and Gretchen and Stewart Stephenson; guests: Betsy and Buddy Amos, Amanda Lile, Daniel Martin and Jaclyn Smith.

VICE-PRESIDENT Libow welcomed the members and guests. She thanked all those who worked so hard and for so many hours to make our Agility Trials successful.

SECRETARY Rusty Jenrette reported that she continues to forward correspondence of Board interest to Board members and of general membership interest to the membership. Event correspondence will be forwarded to relevant Committee Chairs.

TREASURER Helen Sanderford reported that the Club balance is currently \$24,030.58. She moved some money from checking to the Money Market but may have to move it back again at Hunt Test time.

The following memberships or newsletter subscriptions lapsed on Sept. 1, 2015: Adkins, Bastolla, Briggs, Briggs, Burns, Hash, Miller, Riggs, Saloom, and Suscavage, To rejoin, these people will have to fill out a membership form, which is found on the Club website, and mail it with a check to Secretary Rusty Jenrette. All of the receipts are not in yet from the Agility Trials but Helen believes that the Club made enough money on them to make continuing these Trials well worth our while. They are our primary fund raiser.

Helen has sent the Club membership list to AKC in their special format.

SHOW COMMITTEE Stacy Libow reported that the March 2016 Specialty is on track. Since the Libows are moving back to Florida, she said that the Club would need a new Show Chair for 2017. She will continue through the March 2016 Specialty. A Veterans Sweepstakes and a non-regular Veterans Class that includes neutered and unneutered Weimaraners are planned.

RATINGS COMMITTEE A new Chair is needed. Gretchen Stephenson volunteered to be Interim Chair.

HUNT TEST COMMITTEE Betta Breuhaus will check dates with other clubs to avoid conflicting dates.

AGILITY COMMITTEE In Chair Jack Sappenfield's absence, Lucy said that the Agility Trials will be held on July 22-24, 2016 at Bon-Clyde Training Center in Sanford, NC. A judge has been contacted and Jack is waiting for confirmation.

TRACKING COMMITTEE Lucy Sappenfield, reporting for Chair Jack, said that the tracking tests will be held in Alton, VA Jan. 17, 2016 with planning on Jan. 16. Four TD tracks will be offered. The judges a will be Alan Strauss and Elizabeth Goodbody. Larry Edwards is the Chief Track Layer. Volunteers will be needed.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE Chair Lucy Sappenfield announced that the next meeting would be held on Thursday Nov. 19, 2015 at the Backyard Bistro.

OLD BUSINESS The members were reminded that AKC's Responsible Dog Owners Day will be held at the NC State Fairgrounds on Saturday, Sept. 19, 2015 from 10 am to 3 pm. TWC will have an informational booth to educate the public on our breed and on Weimaraner Rescue. It will be staffed by Rusty Jenrette, Stacy Libow, Kathy Page, Jen Wales and Barbara Yates.

NEW BUSINESS The President sent a recommended Nominating Committee to select a slate of officers and board members for the January election.: Jack Sappenfield, Chair, Larry Edwards and Sally Feltner with Gretchen Stephenson as first alternate and Charles Parron as second alternate. 
